
Mission Control Rooms

Mission Control Captains (MCC)



MCCs will:


- Appoint a Scribe
- Share their screen with the rest of the squad
- Lead problem-solving conversation every step of the way
- Operate the mission controls

Pro Tip: Pay close attention to the feedback provided along the way--you'll need it for your final report

IF SUCCESSFUL, MCCs will:

 Enter squad member names and download their Certificate of Honour!

Mission Scribe



Scribes will:

- Note important lessons
- Note questions/concerns
- Provide a verbal report to the larger unit at the mission debrief

Mission Debrief: Knowledge Retrieval

Be prepared to discuss the following points with the whole unit and report on what you learned in your Academic Integrity Mission:

- Using unauthorized help
- Using unauthorized devices during exams
- Student responsibility relating to Academic Integrity policy
- Getting someone else to complete coursework online
- Self-plagiarism
- Getting editing help versus getting proofreading help
- Contract cheating
- Copying without citing a source
- Copying without using quotation marks (even if source is cited)
- Student Support Services
- Citation Styles
- How 'generosity' can contribute to academic misconduct



- It could happen to you, we're all human
- Receiving a notice of suspicion can be freaky!
- You're not alone
- It's normal to feel intimidated and overwhelmed when investigated
- Know that there are a variety of supports available to you
- There are opportunities to respond and even appeal if necessary

Advocacy Support

Based on the university's Academic Integrity Policy (Senate policy 60) there are "Student Advocates" - that's me! I'm one of two on campus.

- Can attend formal meetings, Facilitated Discussions or Non-Facilitated Discussions, or hearings with students
- Can speak on student's behalf
- Assist with the preparation of hearing statements, submission of documents for appeals
- Not actually a student, but employed by your students' union


